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Background

IOM World Migration Report 2020:

- major migration and displacement events during the last two years
- growing recognition of the impacts of environmental and climate
- scale of international migration increasing
- 74 per cent of all international migrants were of working age (20–64 years)
- 52 per cent of the global refugee population was under 18 years of age















Our study – Supporting migrants/refugees in Higher Ed in Europe

 One of three main intellectual outputs was the

"Co-design and develop a Digital Multi-Media Platform Web-Hub for higher education vulnerable migrant students"

 Shifted slightly towards a Web-Hub for the universities to access when supporting students.
















Overview

Learning 2 Live is a collaborative strategic partnership between five European higher education institutions. It is led by the University of Bradford, England and includes higher institutions in Finland, Ireland, Slovenia and Spain. L2L is a one-stop-shop providing information, support and advice to vulnerable migrants who are students at European universities. Our purpose is to help you to succeed and enjoy your third level experience. Learning 2 Live also offers advice, information and support to staff.

Features

- Multilingual front-page gateway that explains what the service offers
- a secure online environment that a user can access information from and share experiences within
- Jump off points to the two other digital outputs (Language Toolkit and App)
- Accessible via mobile, tablet or personal computer
- Logged in access to Language Toolkit specific information and services
- Link to Mobile web App supports, events, location and services in their city that support vulnerable migrant students needs
- Localisation and Accessibility









Description

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Potential further features

- Can be personalised for individual universities to access a tailored range of digital support services, such as:
 - Event calendar with guidance notes for refugees about campus activities that might support integration and learning.
 - Blog postings from campus-based advisors directing specific learning support for vulnerable migrant students.
 - Interactive Google Forms questionnaire enabling vulnerable migrant students to evaluate their learning environment.
 - Online repository of local guidance information and support documents all in one easily accessible place.
 - Specific contact information with direct access email, text and video conference appointment system for tutorials / counselling etc.











Challenges

- Difficulties created by the very differing conditions for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers in different countries.
- E.g. In Ireland we have the "Direct Provision" system.
- Right to work has only recently been achieved (limited)
- International student fees
- University of Sanctuary Status











Other challenges

- We were challenged by multi-partner study and challenge of gaining consensus on feature (multi input – single output)
- Language & cultural differences within team.
- Senior postgrad students completing web development work.
 - Novel pre-release software used
- Differing organisational structures e.g. EDI unit
- Usability testing yet to be completed
- COVID19











Conclusion

- We have demonstrated a proof of concept for a 'scalable' Web Hub
- Potential to expand and scale up
- Decentralise?
